By 2025

- 66% of its suppliers by emissions covering purchased goods and services and capital goods, will have science-based targets.

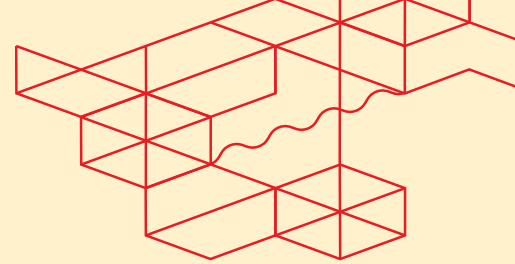
By 2030

- Reduce absolute Scope 1 and 2 emissions 50% from a 2019 base year.
- Reduce absolute Scope 3 emissions from fuel and energy related activities (FERA) 50% from a 2019 base year.
- Achieve 100% clean and renewable energy across our global portfolio.

By 2040

- Reduce absolute Scope 1 and 2 GHG emissions 90% from a 2019 base year.
- Reduce absolute Scope 3 GHG emissions 90% from a 2019 base year.
